

Guidelines for ASHA Advisory Council Members

TERM: Three (3) Years

ELECTION: Elected by Nebraska members of ASHA, through the ASHA Election's process

As members of the Audiology and Speech Language Pathology Advisory Council, Councilors provide input to the ASHA Board of Directors on professional and policy issues. Each state has one representative on each Advisory Council. State association membership is not a requirement to serve on the Advisory Council. For voting privileges on the NSLHA Board and in the state association, full membership must be obtained. A staggered election cycle allows an experienced Councilor to support a newly elected one. A significant amount of Advisory Council business is conducted electronically with only one face-to-face meeting per year, typically held for both Advisory Councils in March.
